# ONE-YEAR PROGRAM - 270-hour program IN PARTNERSHIP WITH PARADISE VALLEY COMMUNITY COLLEGE



- Esports students develop games, compete in Esports, and connect with peer gamers.
- Students in Esports plan, design, produce tournaments (e.g. Arizona High School Smash Bros) including streaming, casting, bracket running, setup/teardown, and all aspects of production and marketing.
- Using specialized knowledge, students compete in League of Legends, Rocket League and other tournaments.

### PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS\*

- Current Sophomore and Junior students may apply (early graduates may not apply)
- Grade 10: Placement into college-level Reading by using ONE of the college placement test below:
  - Accuplacer Next Gen Reading:: 249 or higher
- EdReady Critical Reading: 90 or higher
- SAT Reading Score: 510 or higherACT Reading Score: 22 or higher
- Grade 11: High school GPA of 3.0 or higher, unweighted, based on a 4.0 scale, copy of unofficial high school transcript\* OR one of the
  qualifying test results from options listed above
- Copy of unofficial transcript
- Proof of residency in West-MEC district boundaries
- Copy of birth certificate and immunizations/State Exemption Form due at the time of enrollment
- Transportation is not provided by West-MEC. Families are responsible for providing transportation to and from West-MEC.
- Student State issued ID, driver's license, or driver's permit due at registration
- Parent Proof of Citizenship & 1 year of Arizona residency due at enrollment (non-resident is responsible for the difference between in-state and out-of-state tuition)

\*Program requirements are subject to change per industry age restrictions, certification requirements, and administrative discretion.

### **COST REQUIREMENTS**

Upon acceptance into the program:

- \$150.00 non-refundable registration fee includes enrollment processing
- It is recommended that students have access to a personal computer and reliable internet outside of class to complete assignments and projects.
- The dress code is reviewed annually to meet professional industry standards. Dress code requirements will be addressed at registration and orientation.
- Early Graduation or GED completion will result in the student being charged college tuition fees. <u>Tuition Payment Agreement</u>.
- Empowerment Scholarship Account (ESA) recipients may select West-MEC is an approved vendor\*
- College textbooks & uniforms approximately \$435 (Prices for new textbooks are approximate and may change due to community college requirements.)

### ENROLLMENT INFORMATION

- Acceptance into West-MEC programs may be competitive.
- Students may only be enrolled in one West-MEC Central Program at a time.
- The order for filling seats by grade level is as follows:
  - Current Sophomores
  - Current Juniors\*
- Applications are ranked in part by attendance, GPA, discipline, and career choice (ECAP)
- Copy of birth certificate, proof of residency, and immunizations/State Exemption Form due at time of registration enrollment.
- Program hours are not excused for participation in extracurricular activities, athletics, vacation, or employment.
- West-MEC's priority application submission date is in February. Contact your counselor for your application deadline.
- West-MEC students served under an IEP/504 will need to self-advocate for reasonable accommodations through the Paradise Valley Community College Disability Resource Office. Approved accommodations may differ from those provided in the high school. The Americans with Disabilities Act requires higher education institutions to provide reasonable accommodations to those with documented disabilities, provided an undue hardship is not created.
